### COLORADO INDEPENDENT ETHICS COMMISSION

Minutes of the November 19, 2018, Meeting 1300 Broadway, Room 1C, 9:00 a.m. Denver, Colorado

Present: Chair April Jones, Vice-Chair Jo Ann Sorensen; Commissioner Elizabeth Espinosa Krupa; Commissioner William Leone; and Commissioner Matt Smith.

Also Present: Dino Ioannides, IEC Executive Director; and Gina Cannan and Gina Simonson of the Colorado Attorney General's Office.

#### I. GENERAL BUSINESS

- 1. Chair Jones called the meeting to order at 9:02 a.m.
- 2. The Commission invited public comment and received none.
- 3. Upon motion duly seconded, the Commission unanimously approved the minutes of the October 22, 2018, meeting.
- 4. Mr. Ioannides provided the staff report.
- 5. The Commission called Complaints 16-02 and 17-14, Commissioner Leone Presiding. Mr. Ioannides recused himself. By unanimous consent, the Commission decided to move forward with hiring Ms. Heather Coogan as the alternate investigator for Complaints 16-02 and 17-14.
- 6. The Commission called Complaint 17-28, Commissioner Sorensen presiding. Commissioner Leone recused himself. The complainant was present telephonically. By unanimous consent, the Commission set February 11, 2019, as the hearing date.
- 7. The Commission called Complaint 18-08, Commissioner Sorensen presiding. Commissioner Leone remained recused. Staff reported that briefs regarding jurisdiction are due on December 7, 2018.
- 8. The Commission called Complaints 17-25 and 17-31, Commissioner Smith presiding. The Commission tabled these cases for possible action for later in the meeting.
- 9. The Commission called Complaint 18-22. By unanimous consent, Chair Jones was authorized to rule on any non-dispositive motions.
- 10. Commission counsel provided an update regarding the Marble v. Jones litigation.
- 11. The Commission considered possible updates to its Rules of Procedure.

12. At 9:32 a.m., upon motion duly seconded, the Commission voted unanimously to enter executive session pursuant to C.R.S. § 24-6-402(3)(a)(II), concerning possible updates to the Commission's Rules of Procedure, for purposes of receiving legal advice on specific legal questions.

### II. EXECUTIVE SESSION BUSINESS

13. The Commission met in Executive Session from 9:32 a.m. to 11:25 a.m. to receive legal advice concerning possible updates to the Commission's Rules of Procedure.

### III. GENERAL BUSINESS

- 14. The Commission returned to open session at 11:25 a.m.
- 15. The Commission again took up Complaints 17-25 and 17-31.
- 16. At 11:26 a.m., upon motion duly seconded, the Commission voted unanimously to enter executive session pursuant to C.R.S. § 24-6-402(3)(a)(II), concerning Complaints 17-25 and 17-31, for purposes of receiving legal advice on specific legal questions.

### IV. EXECUTIVE SESSION BUSINESS

17. The Commission met in Executive Session from 11:26 a.m. to 11:38 a.m. to receive legal advice concerning Complaints 17-25 and 17-31.

### V. GENERAL BUSINESS

- 18. The Commission returned to open session at 11:38 a.m.
- 19. Upon motion duly seconded, the Commission unanimously approved the Notice of Issues for Hearing in Complaint 17-25 and the Notice of Issues for Hearing in Complaint 17-31 and authorized Commission staff to transmit the notices to the parties.
- 20. At 11:45 a.m., upon motion duly seconded, the Commission voted unanimously to enter executive session pursuant to C.R.S. § 24-6-402(3)(a)(II) and (III), to discuss Complaints 18-18, 18-19, 18-20, 18-21, 18-23, 18-24, 18-25, 18-26, 18-27, and 18-28, for purposes of receiving legal advice on specific legal questions and which are required to be kept confidential pursuant to Article XXIX, §5(3)(b) of the Colorado Constitution.

## VI. EXECUTIVE SESSION BUSINESS

21. The Commission met in executive session from 11:45 a.m. to 1:19 p.m. concerning Complaints 18-18, 18-19, 18-20, 18-21, 18-23, 18-24, 18-25, 18-26, 18-27, and 18-28. Commissioner Smith recused himself from the executive session discussions of Complaints 18-20 and 18-24.

# VII. GENERAL BUSINESS

22. The Commission returned to open session at 1:19 p.m.

- 23. Upon motion duly seconded, the Commission unanimously dismissed Complaint 18-18 as frivolous and for lack of jurisdiction pursuant to IEC Rules 7.G.1. and 7.G.2.
- 24. Commissioner Leone moved to find Complaint 18-19 non-frivolous. The motion was withdrawn.
- 25. Upon motion duly seconded, the Commission voted 3-1 (with Commissioner Jones opposed and Commissioner Smith recused) to find Complaint 18-24 non-frivolous as to the matters that are within the one-year jurisdiction of the Commission.
- 26. At 1:29 a.m., upon motion duly seconded, the Commission voted unanimously to enter executive session pursuant to C.R.S. § 24-6-402(3)(a)(II) and (III), to discuss Complaints 18-23, 18-25, 18-26, 18-27, and 18-28, for purposes of receiving legal advice on specific legal questions and which are required to be kept confidential pursuant to Article XXIX, §5(3)(b) of the Colorado Constitution.

#### VIII. EXECUTIVE SESSION BUSINESS

27. The Commission met in executive session from 1:29 a.m. to 1:50 p.m. concerning Complaints 18-23, 18-25, 18-26, 18-27, and 18-28.

### IX. GENERAL BUSINESS

- 28. The Commission returned to open session at 1:50 p.m.
- 29. Upon motion duly seconded, the Commission unanimously dismissed Complaint 18-23 as frivolous pursuant to IEC Rule 7.G.1.
- 30. Staff was instructed to obtain additional information pertaining to Complaints 18-25, 18-26, 18-27, and 18-28.
- 31. Having no further business, the Commission adjourned at 1:53 p.m. The next regular meeting is scheduled for December 17, 2018, at 9:00 a.m., 1300 Broadway, Denver, Colorado.
