UPON stipulation of the parties and the Independent Ethics Commission being advised in the matter, the following Order is entered:

- 1. The Independent Ethics Commission finds that there is a factual basis for adopting this stipulation as an order of the Commission.
- 2. Section 24-18-108(2)(d) and 24-50-117, C.R.S. (2010) are strict liability statutes which do not require a culpable mental state. Respondent admits the factual allegations in paragraphs 1-13 of the Verified Complaint. Respondent Whitfield further admits that his actions constituted violations of sections 24-18-108(2)(d) and 24-50-117 without any culpable mental state.
- 3. Respondent Whitfield shall pay a penalty in the sum of \$400 to the State of Colorado.
- 4. Respondent Whitfield shall relinquish the existing certification for Colorado Notary Solutions. Simultaneously, the Secretary of State shall issue a new certification for Colorado Notary Solutions. The new certification shall include the next available certification nunhmber. There shall be no time gap between the certifications.
- 5. Respondent Whitfield shall remove from Colorado Notary Solutions' webpage the phrase, "Prior to founding Colorado Notary Solutions."
